Reading

Reading is essential for learning in all areas of the curriculum and so we will be doing lots on a day to day basis. Children will read independently and as a class. Our class novel this term is Goodnight Mr Tom, a classic that ties into our Britain at War topic. In addition, we would like children to read 5 times at home. They will have two books, one that is colour banded to match their reading age and a reading for pleasure book. When reading to an adult, the colour book should be read. This ensures that the reading is challenging and at their individual level. We now have books for all levels, with reading ages into year 7 and 8 if needed. We will be reviewing the children's reading ages in the coming weeks and will do so termly.

Homework

Homework this year will be closely related to our main topics., this term Britain at War. Pupils will have one activity to complete each week which will reinforce learning from class. In addition please read 5 times and practice TT Rockstars twice a week. Spellings will now be learnt and practiced daily in class. Homework should be handed in on Wednesdays and will be sent home on a Friday.
