## Norton/West Chinnock long term data:

By the end of the 2021/2022 school year, the percentage of girls at Norton in key stage 2 achieving age related expectations or above in mathematics and reading will increase from 70-80% (2018) to 88% per cent, and to maintain high levels of attainment (including 30-40% of children being above age related expectations) by the end of 2024/5.
