Dear Parents and Carers,

I would like to wish you a very warm welcome to the new school year of 2023-24! Everyone at school hopes that you have had a good summer and are ready and eager to be back. I appreciate that there will be a lot of information sent out today. Wishing to avoid an information overload, I aim to keep this welcome letter as succinct and as useful as possible.

Morning Routines

A reminder that the children line up on the playground in classes and enter the school at 8.50am. Please note that parents are responsible for children until this time. For anyone requiring an early drop off there is our Breakfast club which is available from 7.45am with different options (with or without food). For more information, please contact us.

After School Clubs:

We are pleased to offer a range of clubs after school. There will also be lunchtime clubs such as chess and football on offer which children may take part in (no sign-up required). To cover the ongoing costs of running afterschool clubs, the school is reviewing our approach to charging. Clubs are currently free of charge and we will communicate before next half-term if this needs to change.

After school wrap around care until 5.00pm is available for all year groups on a Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday. Registration and payment is via the pro-coaching website. To keep operating this service at the current cost, pro-coaching require a minimum number to sign-up.

Safeguarding

The designated safeguarding lead is Mrs Jaggard who is also the SENDCO (Special Educational Needs and Disabilities Coordinator). Senior Teacher Mrs Bryne and Headteacher Mr Caswell are the deputy designated safeguarding leads. If you have a concern, please speak with a member of the team.

Attendance

We know that there is a clear link between attendance and attainment. Please bring your child to school on time and avoid term time holidays and trips. Communications

The majority of our communications will be sent out by email. Each week on a Monday there is a Parent Update and at the end of term, there is a Newsletter. We are not currently operating a texting system and hope to get this up and running soon for notifications.

Permissions, payments, homework, sports fixtures, trips and school reports may be sent as paper copies.

For the time being, we are pausing the use of Google Classroom (which we set up during the pandemic for remote learning).

We do have an Instagram account and Facebook page where we publicise our schools. These are accessible via our <u>website</u>. In very rare situations where we cannot access the School IT Server, for example in adverse weather conditions, we may use this form of communication to send an update.

Lastly, during the year, the pupils will publish their much anticipated school newspaper, The Hamdon Hoot. Please keep an eye out for this and we hope you enjoy reading it, as we are very proud of the work the children do in producing it.

Learning and Curriculum

At the beginning of each Term (September, January and April), teachers will send out a curriculum overview and class timetable to communicate what your child will be learning.

I am pleased that each classroom have names that come from the trees growing around the school. Year R is Willow Class, Years 1 and 2 are Birch Class, Years 3 and 4 are Hazel Class and Years 5 and 6 are Rowan Class.

Keeping you informed

Throughout the year, there will be information sessions for parents to attend including Phonics (for Year R and 1), Multiplication (for Year 3 and 4) and SATs (Standard Assessment Tests - for year 6).

There will also be parents' evenings, where you will meet and speak with your child's teacher in November and in March. In July, you will receive your child's school report for the year. Celebrating success

Every week, we celebrate success in a Celebration Assembly on Monday morning. Once a half-term, we invite parents to join us to recognise achievements in our Awards Assembly.

Parent Forum and Parent Champions

In addition, we also have our Parent Champions who you can speak with confidentially. They bring any issues to the Parent Forums for discussion. There are three of these per school year, one per term. We will send a poster nearer the time explaining who our parent champions are. If you would be interested in becoming a Parent Champion, please let us know.

FONS

The Friends of Norton School (FONS) parents association raise vital funds for trips, experiences and 'wow' items for the children. Importantly, their fundraising brings our school community together. They are always looking for new members and helpers, so please get in touch if you can lend a hand.

Parent and Headteacher Coffee Mornings

I am delighted to be holding a coffee morning for parents per each half term during the year. The first one is from 9-10am on 27th September at the School. I hope that you will come along and that parent helpers will assist in getting this set up with me. I aim to have an area
